Memory Lane

Dilwyn Roberts from Wrexham has been kind enough to share some of his childhood memories with our Home Visitor Rob Sanderson for this months newsletter, this is one he recalls from the second world war.

One afternoon Dilwyn heard shooting outside his house. He ran out and saw above the mountain a British Spitfire attacking German bombers, suddenly smoke poured out of one of the German bombers engines and it nosedived straight into the ground.

The following day he and his friends went to look at the German bomber, the wreckage of the plane was untouched, so Dilwyn and his mates took some of it home, Dilwyn was going to use his to make a rabbit hutch.

However, the following day Dilwyn got an unexpected call, it was the local policeman and a British RAF officer, they said that someone had seen them bringing the wreckage home they asked if they could have the pieces of the plane back. So no rabbit hutch for him or the rabbit.

The next day Dilwyn and his friends went to look at the plane again but when they arrived the plane was taped off and guarded by two RAF officers, they warned the boys to stay away and not to come back.

The boys did not return, however when Dilwyn got married they moved in to a cottage 20 yards away from the crash and he took his wife to show her where the wreckage used to be and you'll be pleased to know he did build his rabbit a hutch, just not with the scattered parts of the bomber plane!
