From the get-go, I also volunteered at a Vision Supports Social Group and a Walking Group that was held locally.



## Royal Society for Blind Children Access Unlimited

A while ago we wrote a short piece about our involvement in the RSBC Access Unlimited Project as a partner. With the new year approaching we wanted to give you an update about the project and the new training that has been developed.

We have had a great year promoting the services of RSBC to young children networks and organisations. We are now focussing on promoting the new capacity training.

This training is aimed at anyone providing a service for young people whether it's running groups, activities or delivering services.

The aim is to help them to review the accessibility of their service for children and young people with a vision impairment and increase confidence in communication.



This training has been very popular so far and we would like to encourage as many local groups providing services for children and young people in Wales to attend this two hour virtual course.

Visolux XL FHD - A Large 12inch screen with 2x to 22x magnification. Can be used with the controls or by using the touch screen. In HD and can be plugged into the TV as well to project the image. Has a kick stand so easy to use and manoeuvre. Screen is crystal clear. Costs £1499 on their website but with the code it's £665

Smartlux Digital - With a 5-inch LCD screen, 3x to 15x magnification. Has a built in stand so can be used in three ways, hand-held for mobile use, low stand for reading material and high stand for writing underneath. Again, quality of the screen and image is brilliant. Also has a photo function where images can be taken and stored. Costs £590 on their website but with the code it's £285.

#### **Sight Loss Information Line**

With the support of the Local Eye Health Network (LEHN) and with funding from the National Lottery, Vision Support have launched the Cheshire Sight Loss Information line in partnership with East Cheshire Eye Society.

The Information Line is a free service which works throughout Cheshire to help people with a vision impairment by providing them with support and guidance through bespoke information packs, signposting to relevant services and organisation that can help.
